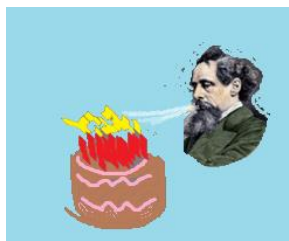

THE LITERARY BIRTHDAY SPOTLIGHT



- **September 13, 1916 - Roald Dahl:** Before authoring books such as *Willy Wonka & the Chocolate Factory* he served as a spy for the British government, romancing powerful US women for useful information.
- **October 8, 1943 - R. L. Stine:** As the writer of the *Goosebumps* series, he kept busy. A new installation was published every month from July 1993 to December 1997.
- **November 25, 1946 - Marc Brown:** The author and illustrator of the *Arthur* children's series. He hides the names of his children (Tolon, Tucker & Eliza) in every book!

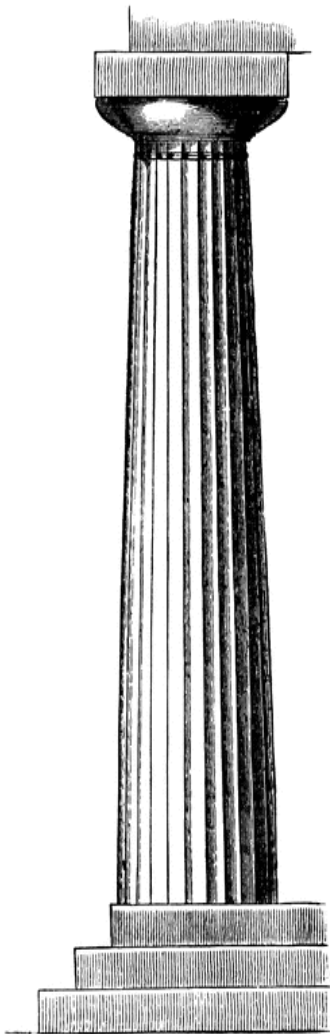
